In this teleconference, Ms. Resendiz will discuss the problem of Human Trafficking and the challenges of identifying and working with victims of this terrible crime. Information on how victims of trafficking are different than other victims will be presented. Ms. Resendiz will also highlight how those working in the field of victims' rights can play a pivotal role in assisting victims of Human Trafficking and what resources are available to victims. A brief overview of modern-day slavery and its prevalence in the U.S. will be discussed.

Ms. Resendiz has focused her academic and professional life on education as a tool in conflict situations. She has designed curricula and conducted workshops on topics ranging from media literacy for young children to health education for senior citizens. She currently lives in Phoenix, Arizona, where after years as a middle school teacher, she has recently turned her efforts to the problem of modern-day slavery. In her role as training coordinator, Ms. Resendiz works throughout the community to spread awareness of Human Trafficking and to build skills for combating this horrible crime.
